



## We Offer a Variety of Planned Giving Methods to Meet Your Needs

**OUTRIGHT GIFTS** - This includes gifts of cash, stock, bonds, real estate or personal property.

**ESTABLISHING A FUND** - Establish a fund at the Community Foundation in your name, in the name of your family or anyone you wish to honor or memorialize.

**WILLS AND BEQUESTS** - Donors have the option of contributing to the Community Foundation through planned giving, such as bequests made through wills and trusts.

**LIFE INSURANCE** - By assigning ownership of life insurance policies to the Community Foundation, you can receive an immediate income tax charitable deduction in the amount of the policies' present value.

**CHARITABLE GIFT ANNUITY** - You can make a gift of cash or property to your Community Foundation now, get immediate tax benefits and ensure yourself or a loved one receive fixed quarterly or annual income payments for life.

**CHARITABLE REMAINDER TRUST** - You can place cash or property in a trust that pays annual income to you or another named beneficiary for life. After your death, the remainder of the trust transfers to your Community Foundation and is placed into a charitable fund you have selected.

**CHARITABLE LEAD TRUST** - You can place cash or property into a trust that pays a fixed amount to your Community Foundation for a selected number of years. Once this period ends, the assets held by the trust are transferred to the beneficiaries you name.

We encourage you to seek assistance from your advisor to help you select the giving methods best suited for you and your charitable intentions.

## Charitable Funds Options

### **ESTABLISH A NAMED UNRESTRICTED FUND:**

A permanent endowment fund in your name, your family's name, the name of a loved one or your business. Your initial contribution and any future contributions are invested immediately allowing the earnings to be used to fund the community's ever-changing needs, now and forever.

### **ESTABLISH A FIELD-OF-INTEREST FUND:**

A permanent endowment fund in your name, your family's name, the name of a loved one or your business. Your initial contribution and any future contributions are invested immediately allowing the earnings to be used to fund charitable activity in the areas of most interest to you, such as education, health, or the environment.

### **ESTABLISH A DESIGNATED FUND:**

A permanent endowment fund in your name, your family's name, the name of a loved one or your business. Your initial contribution and any future contributions are invested immediately allowing the earnings to be used to fund your favorite local charities on an annual basis. This is a great way to simplify and streamline the funding of multiple charitable interests.

### **ESTABLISH A DONOR-ADVISED FUND:**

A permanent endowment fund in your name, your family's name, the name of a loved one or your business. A Donor-Advised Fund allows you, your family or your company to be actively involved with your gift by giving you the opportunity to work with the Community Foundation grant-making staff to suggest ongoing uses for that gift - targeting causes and programs you care about most. Your approved grants are issued to charities in the name of your fund.

## Because You Asked...(How to Make a Gift)

Those wishing to establish a fund within the Community Foundation, through either a current gift or a testamentary one, should call the Foundation office at (989) 354-6881, or toll free at (877) 354-6881. Others who wish to make a contribution to any of the funds should make their checks payable to the Community Foundation, and note the fund intended to be benefited on the memo line of the check. ## Tax Credit Information

### TURN \$150 INTO \$400 OVERNIGHT

When you make a \$400 gift to any endowment fund of the Community Foundation for Northeast Michigan or its affiliates, it will cost you far less, thanks to Michigan's generous state tax credit.

After the state tax credit and federal tax deductions, a \$400 gift will cost a couple in the 25% tax bracket just \$150.37 . . . that includes the stamp!

Of course, even more rewarding are the good works your gift makes possible. A gift to your Community Foundation will be a gift for good, for ever!

This calculation is based on 25% income tax bracket. 50% is the maximum Michigan state tax credit.



## The Legacy Society

THE LEGACY SOCIETY is an organization of friends and benefactors of the Community Foundation for Northeast Michigan and its affiliates who have made plans to leave a gift to the Foundation.

Too often, such gifts go unrecognized because they come at the end of the donors' lives. The Legacy Society provides a way to recognize and thank donors during their lifetimes.

To become a member of the Legacy Society, the only requirement is a statement of establishment or intent to leave a gift to the Community Foundation through a bequest, charitable trust, life insurance or other planned gift. Membership can be anonymous if desired.

Members of the Legacy Society are special people who have provided for the future of northeast Michigan through the Community Foundation. The purpose of the Legacy Society is to commend and recognize these people for their foresight and interest.

# How to Apply for a Grant

The Community Foundation is always looking for effective program and project ideas that can improve life in northeast Michigan. The Foundation generally funds projects and programs in the areas of education, arts and culture, health, human services, community development and the environment. In its grantmaking, the Community Foundation considers the needs and opportunities of the region and tries to identify issues on which its resources can have an impact.

Grant requests are accepted from organizations serving northeast Michigan that are tax-exempt public charities under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or schools, churches (for non-religious purposes), or government agencies.

In general, the Community Foundation gives priority to applications in any field or program area that reflect one or more of the following characteristics:

- \* develops or tests new solutions to community problems
- \* are preventative and/or provide early and sustained intervention
- \* facilitates cooperation and collaboration among organizations and avoids duplications of services
- \* improves the quality of nonprofit organizations by means of more efficient and effective operation
- \* promotes personal achievement and independence
- \* increases individual access to community services
- \* encourages volunteerism, civic and community involvement

In order to make the best use of available funds, the Community Foundation does not usually make grants for the following:

- \* construction projects, whether for new building campaigns or routine maintenance
- \* annual giving campaigns or capital campaigns
- \* normal operating expenses (except for start-up purposes)
- \* religious or sectarian purposes
- \* individuals
- \* advocacy or political purposes
- \* loans
- \* multi-year/sustained funding
- \* re-granting
- \* conferences

Seeking grant support from the Community Foundation is a relatively simple, straightforward process. The Foundation encourages representatives of interested organizations to call and talk with a program officer. Grantmaking guidelines for the Community Foundation for Northeast Michigan and its three affiliates are available on the Foundation and affiliate websites. Grant inquiries are welcome any time.

All applications are carefully considered as part of the grant making process and are reviewed by Community Foundation staff and by volunteers who serve on the Foundation's and affiliate Grant Distribution Committees. The Foundation's trustees make all final fund decisions at meetings held quarterly.

During the 2003-2004 academic year, 61 students from Alcona, Alpena, Montmorency, and Presque Isle counties reviewed grant applications for youth-related programs and made funding recommendations to the CFNEM board of trustees. NEMYAC is a permanent committee of the Community Foundation for Northeast Michigan (CFNEM). In the past ten years, NEMYAC members have recommended over \$500,000 in grants to fund projects and programs for area youth. Thanks to a challenge grant from the W.K. Kellogg Foundation, NEMYAC has over \$1 million dollars permanently endowed in a youth field-of-interest fund. This permanently endowed fund will generate grant funds for youth projects every year...forever.

# Funds of the Foundation

Through the generosity of thousands of donors, the Community Foundation is able to hold a variety of funds that can address not only the needs of our community - but also the specific charitable interest of our supporters. These funds create the "community capital" vital to the health of our region and to the quality of life of the residents of northeast Michigan.

Donors can create permanent endowment funds that provide a lasting memorial of the commitment to the region of the donor, their family or business. Flexible funds and those supporting general fields of interest provide support to address ever-changing community needs. Other donors turn to the Community Foundation to create Donor Advised Funds that allow them to continue to participate in their philanthropy. Still others create permanent funds to support their favorite charitable organizations. Some nonprofit organizations take advantage of the Community Foundation's resources and services to build endowment funds with us to support their operations.

Whatever the donor's charitable interests, funds can be established to carry out those interests in perpetuity. The following lists describe the funds established with the Community Foundation.


